MCSM is a program designed to offer:

- One-Year Certificate in Ministry
- Two-Year Diploma in Ministry
- The certificate and diploma programs consist solely of Bible and Ministry courses.
- When completed, these courses can also be applied to Associate of Arts or Bachelor of Arts degrees in ministry. This will require some liberal arts courses for credibility and transferability.
- All of these programs are fully accredited and are eligible for Title IV federal assistance, including Pell Grants. (Our studies have shown that nearly 80% of PCG constituents applying for a Pell Grant have received some sort of funding.)
- These studies, presented in 8-week terms, are available six times a year with all courses available every term.

frequently asked questions [faq]

Q: What is Accreditation?

A. Accreditation is a process whereby institutions of higher learning are reviewed by an accrediting association to ascertain that the school is indeed performing according to published claims. It is an intensive process, requiring extensive self-study and overview by prominent educators. Only accreditation associations approved by the U. S. Department of Education can assure you of appropriate recognition and quality control.

Q. What accreditation does Messenger College hold?

A. Messenger College is accredited with the Transnational Association of Christian Colleges and Schools (TRACS). This accreditation is recognized by the U. S. Department of Education for all Title IV grants and privileges. TRACS is also recognized by the Council for Higher Education Accreditation (CHEA)

Q. Will of other colleges and universities accept Messenger College Credits and Degrees?

A. Acceptance of credits from another institution is always under the control of the receiving school. Few colleges or universities automatically accept credits from another institution, even within the same accreditation. Messenger College degrees have been accepted by several major seminaries and universities including Asbury Seminary, Assemblies of God Theological Seminary, Church of God Theological Seminary, Oral Roberts University, Liberty University, and other similar institutions including some state universities.

Q. How do I apply for Pell Grants and other Federal Title IV benefits?

A. The Messenger College Financial Aid office will

be happy to work with you to file for these programs. An email to: info@messengercollege.edu will connect you with this office. It may also be reached by phone: 417-624-7070 Ext. 308. Many students find that the Pell Grants will pay most if not all the cost of their quality education.

Q. Do I need to have high speed internet?

A. You will need to have high speed internet (DSL, Cable, Wireless). If you have dial-up we can send you the lectures on CD but you will need an internet connection to take the tests and establish an attendance record. You will also need to have a sound card (or if you are using CDs, a CDROM drive for your computer).

Q. What degrees does Messenger College provide?

A. The online program began with the degrees in Christian Ministry. Now work has begun on the BA degree in Business Administration and a BA degree in Music will be available soon. Ministry concentrations may be in Pastoral, Intercultural, Discipleship, Youth and Biblical Studies.
