Articulation Agreement Between Messenger College (MC) and Accelerated Institute of Ministry (AIM) - Arkansas

Provisions Governing the Agreement:

- 1. AIM students must meet MC's minimum academic & admissions requirements as stated in the most current catalog to be considered for admission to Messenger College.
- 2. Under Messenger College's current degree completion, AIM students may transfer the following credits* once completing at least one course at MC:

AIM Course	MC Course
Old Testament History and Literature	OTB1013 Old Testament History and Literature

^{*}This list may be modified at the discretion of MC, after written notification to AIM, to include or exclude other specific courses.

- Any course transfers will be reviewed and evaluated by the Academic Office based on MC's current
 course requirements and credit transfer policy. Only courses with an earned grade of "C" or better
 will transfer.
- 4. If the student decides to pursue a bachelor's degree, both program and institutional capstone courses must be completed at Messenger College.

Students are advised that MC courses are 8 or 16 weeks. Financial aid is available for most students enrolled in MC courses; however, each student should contact the Financial Aid Director individually to ensure their eligibility.

This articulation agreement will remain in effect unless either party gives thirty days written notice of intent to dissolve the agreement.

All students may access any information about this agreement and/or federal regulations in accordance with Transnational Association of Christian Colleges and Schools' (TRACS) standards on MC's website and in MC's publications, including the current Academic Catalog.
